

## June 2016

There were a total of **604** cancellations this month compared with 175 in January and 193 in February, 195 in March, 299 in April and 315 in May. June is therefore GTR's worst month to date, this year.

Of particular interest is that on Thursday 23rd June, GTR cancelled a total of 62 trains on a non-strike day. That compares with 35 trains that they cancelled on Tuesday 21st June which was a strike day!

**517** trains were cancelled outright and never passed through Hassocks, at least as passenger trains  
**87** trains ran but failed to stop.

189 were due to issues with train crew  
88 were due to the request of the train operator  
52 were due to planning errors  
34 were due to late arrival of train crew from an inbound service  
33 were due to planned cancellations due to the industrial dispute  
26 were due to unknown reasons  
31 were due to flooding  
11 were due to an unspecified problem with the train  
7 were due to a problem with the traction equipment  
6 were due to a train being cancelled to allow a slower train to run  
6 were due to problems at the depot  
6 were due to a problem with the track  
5 were due to a signal failure  
3 were due to a lightning strike  
3 were due to over-running engineering works  
3 were due to trespass  
2 were due to a person hit by a train  
3 were due to a problem with the on-board safety systems of the train  
2 were due to problems with the electrified line  
1 were due to a track circuit failure  
1 were due to a points failure  
1 were due to power supply problems  
1 were due to a problem with the overhead line power collection equipment on the train  
1 were due to a problem with the brakes  
1 were due to the Emergency Alarm operated  
1 were due to a passenger taken ill
